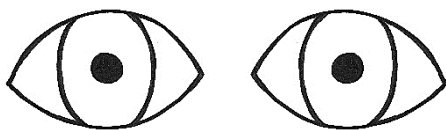

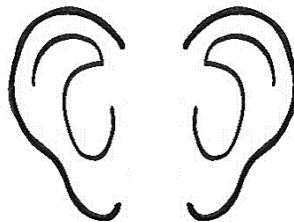
Help me, O Lord, to be Merciful with my

Eyes



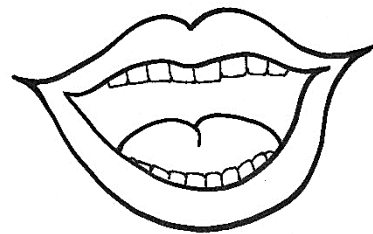
Let me look for what is

Ears



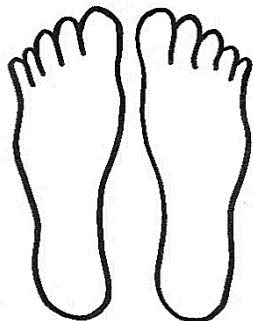
Let me hear my

Tongue



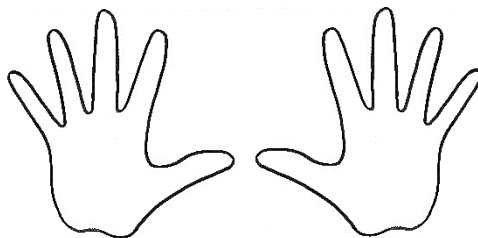
Let me always speak

Feet



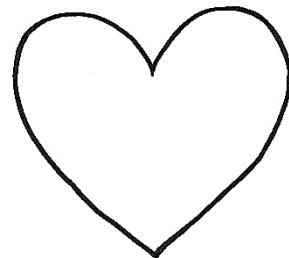
Let me hurry to
