## Our 5 Senses and His Word Instructions for Lesson

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1. Print in color ahead of your lesson:

- All the following pages


2. Trim:

- The two priest overlay visual aids

3. Show, read \& discuss with your children:

- The "We are Human" visual aid

4. Show, read \& discuss with your children:

- The "God" visual aid

5. Show your children:

- The bread visual aid

Say to your children:

- Before Consecration, the altar bread is bread.

Read to your children:

- The words on the bread visual aid

6. Say to the children:

- God can use His Word to do things that go beyond our 5 senses.
- God can do anything!
- He can do things that we cannot see, smell, taste, feel or hear.

Place:

- The priest overlay visual aid with "Jesus' Body" over the bread visual aid

Read to your children:

- The words on either side of the priest on the priest overlay visual aid
- Then the words on the two combined visual aid, beginning with "It looks like bread" and emphasizing the change of words to "Jesus' Body."

7. Show your children:

- The wine visual aid

Say to your children:

- Before Consecration, the wine is just wine.

Read to your children:

- The words on the wine visual aid

8. Place:

- The priest overlay visual aid with "Jesus' Blood" over the wine visual aid

Read to your children:

- The words on either side of the priest on the priest overlay visual aid
- Then the words on the two combined visual aid, beginning with "It looks like wine" and emphasizing the change of words to "Jesus' Blood."

9. If desired, show, read, and discuss with your children:

- The stain glass visual aid with the quote.

10. Say to your children:

- Our belief that the Eucharist IS the Real Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus, His True Presence, is the cornerstone of our Catholic faith.
- The Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1324) which means:
- (Source) The Eucharist, Jesus, is where our faith comes from. He is where our faith starts. He is the origin, the beginning of our faith.
- (Summit) The Eucharist is the highest point of our Catholic faith. Believing in the Eucharist is the very top level of our faith.
