# Let's Learn! Relics – Holy Reminders

#### Words to Know

**Relic**: part or all of a canonized saint's body or physical objects that have a direct association with the saints Relics are divided into three "classes"

**<u>Reliquary</u>:** a container holding a relic

<u>Veneration</u>: an expression of reverence for the holiness of the saint



## Three Classes of Relics

First-Class Relic all or part of the body of a saint

#### Second-Class Relic


something that was owned by the saint or part of what was used to kill a martyred saint

### Third-Class Relic

any item that touches a first or second-class relic

#### What do you do when you see a relic?

Kiss or Touch the relic or the reliquary. Ask the saint to pray for you or someone you love.



A **relic** 

is similar to

a keepsake memory

(example: baby teeth or first clipping of a baby's hair) or **a family freasure** 

(example: your great grandma's pearl ring or your grandparent's cross)

that is passed through the generation.

Pilgrims (visitors) often ask for the saint to intercede (pray) on their behalf before God for spiritual assistance, physical healing, or other particular graces.

Relics remind us of the holiness of a saint and the saint wanting to do God's will and their actions actually doing God's will.

Relics remind us to have the saints be our role models.

The actual relic cannot do a miracle. However, God can use a relic of a saint to heal, just like he used his cloak to heal the woman with the hemorrhage. The relic is an instrument for God's miraculous power.





Relics are very precious. We treat them with respect.

**Relics are honored and venerated, but not worshipped.**
